

HOOPLA Digital Media Service

Hoopla is a FREE digital media service that allows patrons to borrow movies, music, audiobooks, ebooks, comics and tv shows!! All you need is a library card. If you don't have a library card you can sign up online to

receive one for FREE!

You stream immediately through desktop browser or hoopla mobile app. You can also download to phones or tablets for offline access.

You are allowed 4 barrows per month and they are automatically returned and removed at the end of the lending period.

- 1. Visit hoopladigital.com or download the hoopla app
- 2. Fill out information (email, create password)
- 3. Choose your "library" (or enter Delaware libraries)
- 4. Choose "Next"
- 5. Enter library card number (account number)
